1 As a child you are pure and innocent as snow.



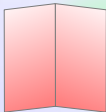
2 The teenager becomes a whirlpool of red feelings.



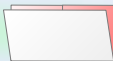
3 Get a crush ...



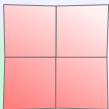
4 ... and leave each other again.



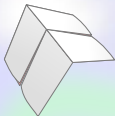
5 Get another crush ...



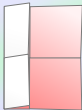
6 ... and leave each other again again.

7 Meet somebody you love ...



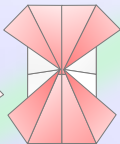
8 ... who loves you back.



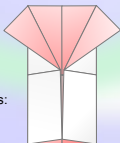

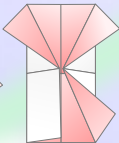
13 Worst of all: you are reduced to the everyday routine.

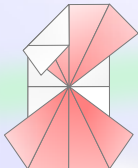

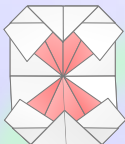

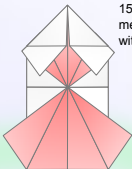
